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With reference to my letter of December 20, 1940, there is quoted below a table showing imports of automotive vehicles and parts into Tientsin duty-paid at other ports in China which were not included either in Zholosure No. 2, giving a list of motor trucks and passenger cars imported into Tientsin from January-October, 1940, or in Inclosure No. 3, Siving Chinese Haritime Customs returns of duty-paid imports of motor vehicles into Tientsin and Chinwangtao from foreign countries from January-September, 1940;

The above figures are of course included in the Customs import returns for the ports indicated, but these figures should have been added by this office to the reported direct imports into Tientsin in computing its estimates of the total number of vehicles in operation in this district as of December 31, 1940.
