errest toxt is will be an important Imports into Shanghai of raw cotton during August 1931 (the first month of the new season for American cotton), amounted to 50,300 bales; imports of Indian cotton during August totalled 36,379 bales; and imports of Egyptian cotton amounted to 450,000 bales. The average the mies or short en weight of bales from these various countries are: American - 500 lbs., Indian - 400 lbs., and Egyptian - 700 lbs.

Total stocks of raw cotton in wharf warehouses on August 31, 1931 were estimated at 122,941 bales of the following classification: American 58,959; Indian 41,332; Chinese 21,017; and sundry 1,633.

Recently, American cotton has been quoted in the Shanghai market at prices which are very cheap as compared to the price of Chinese cotton. However, Chinese cotton prices have ruled steady due to the unfavorable crop news received from most of the cotton growing districts, and because movements of Chinese cotton are delayed by flood conditions in the Targtone Valley. Indian cotton is stated to be slightly out of line so far as price is concerned when compared to American cotton.
