I read with interest the enclosure attached to your letter of March 18 on the above subject. I should like to know what action has been taken regarding the protection of the Sun Kist oranges. I am interested also to know whether or not Sun Maid raisins, Wrigley's chewing gum, and Beechnut fruit drops, which are being imitated in Hong Kong, are receiving the attention of any of those who may be interested in bringing action against the imitators. Kindly let me have such information as you may be able to secure on this interesting subject. I suggest before going into the matter you discuss it with Consul Jenkins as it is possible the Consulate is interested in making representations to the Colonial authorities.
