Industrial Accidents in China During 1936.

The Central Bureau of Factory Inspection of the Ministry of Industry has recently released a report regarding industrial accidents during 1936.

According to this report, which does not include the International Settlement or French Concession of Shanghai and probably does not include similar areas in other cities, there were a total of 2,724 accidents and 3,976 casualties. The amount of loss incurred is also given although information is not available as to how this figure is arrived at. Following are statistics as presented in this report:
