
The term "Manchukuo Government."

I have your letter of January 10 on the above subject. I agree with you thoroughly that we should not use the expression "Manchukuo Government." 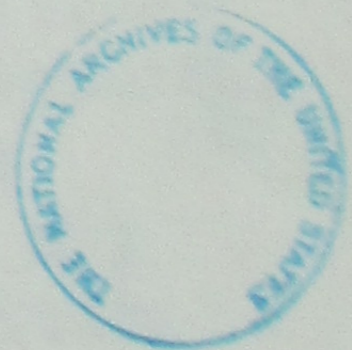
