Dear Sir: In receipt of a letter from Assistant Commercial Attache
Halleck A. Davis, relative to the market for bottled coca cola in
Japan. Reference is made to your letter of April 6, requesting in-
formation supplementary to that furnished you in our recent cor-
respondence in regard to the labeling of Coca Cola products in
Rumania, Yugoslavia, Siam, Spain, Sweden, and Switzerland.

Upon further research we find that no mention is made of
special regulations regarding the labeling of such products in
any of these countries. As mentioned before, I believe you will
find that the special memorandum covering the marking of goods
to show country of origin will furnish you with all necessary in-
formation in regard to the labeling of Coca Cola products for

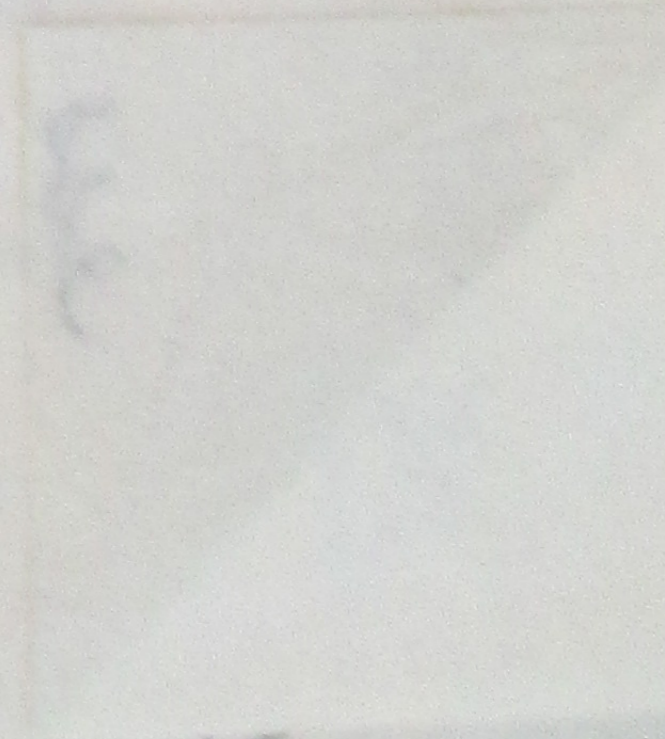
