Mr. Douglas Young

Tokyo, May 3.

Mr. Douglas George Young, proprietor of the "Japan Chronicle," whose death occurred in Kobe yesterday, was only 44 years of age.

He was a cousin of Mr. Douglas Mortimer Young, the founder of the Far Eastern Advertising Agency.

Owing to the similarity of the two cousins' names, it was believed for a time that it was Mr. Douglas Mortimer Young who had died. It is now established that this was not the case.—Reuter.

The late Mr. Young, it is understood, was born in Kobe and became editor of the "Japan Chronicle" after his father died. He was in the Naval Air Arm during the War, retiring with the rank of Commander. He had never joined any journalistic body and had come East again to help his father.
