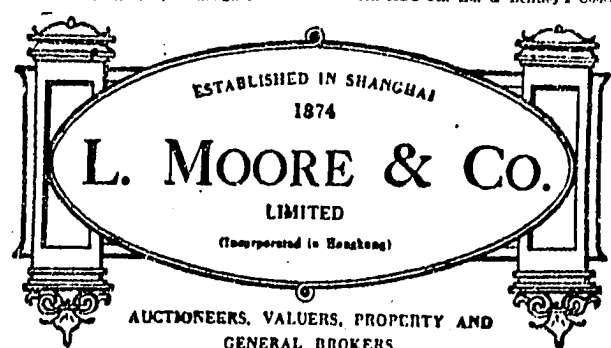

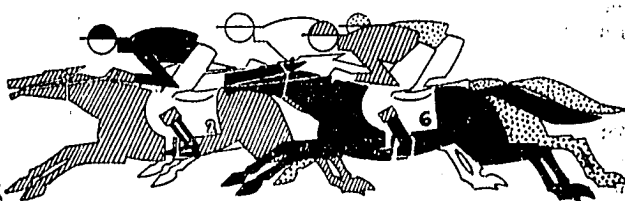

Wreck of S.S. "Foching"

Tenders are invited for the salvage of the cargo and hull of the S.S. "Foching," which now lies sunk in the South Channel Entrance to the Yangtze River in a position from which House Island Beacon bears 001°, distant 4.05 miles.

The wreck is heading north-east and lies in about 19 feet of water at low water with a list to starboard of about 20 degrees. The mast and funnel are visible at low water.

Tenders should be in two parts, as follows:—

(1) Salvage of cargo

(2) Salvage of vessel

Tenderers are required to furnish adequate evidence of previous experience in salvage work and suitable financial guarantees of their ability to carry out a contract.

The Chinese Maritime Customs do not bind themselves to accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenders should state the time required for salvage of the cargo and vessel.

Sealed tenders marked Tender S.S. "Foching" should be in the hands of the undersigned not later than 10 a.m. on 12th December, 1932, when they will be opened in the presence of any tenderers who wish to be present.
