

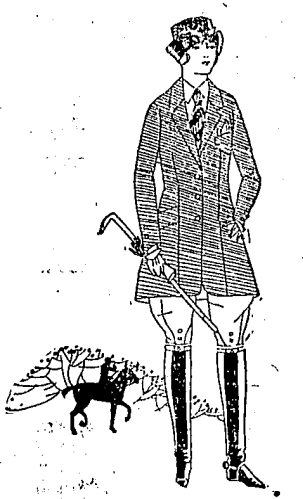

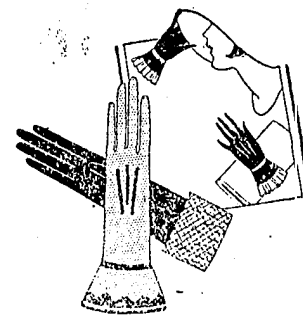

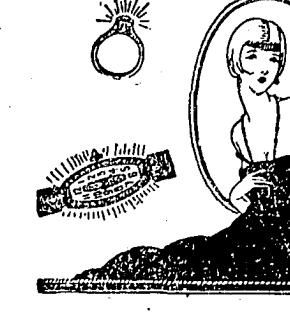

 1 cup sugar  
 1 cup milk  
 1 lb. flour (or enough to make good cake batter)  
 ½ cup butter  
 2 eggs  
 spice to taste; pinch of salt  
 Try this for afternoon tea, or have it at eleven o'clock with a cup of coffee—you'll try it again. It contains nourishing food value as well as being just delicious.

**Method:** Dissolve the yeast and about a tablespoonful of sugar in the lukewarm milk, add half the flour and beat well and set aside in a warm place to rise until light. Then add the butter and sugar creamed, the spice, the fruit, the balance of the flour, or enough to make a good cake batter, the eggs well beaten, and the salt. Mix well and pour into well-greased cake tins, filling them about half, cover and let rise until about one hour, when the tins should be nearly full. 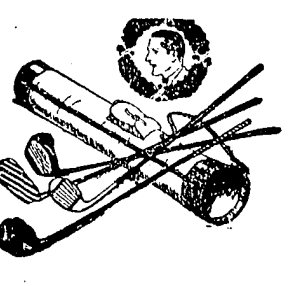
**Turkish Delight**

 4 cups sugar  
 Grated rind of one orange  
 ½ cup orange and lemon juice, mixed  
 1 cup nut-meats, any kind  
 Few grains salt  
 Soak gelatine in water, bring slowly to boiling point, add sugar and salt, boil twelve minutes. Add fruit juices and grated orange rind. Stir in nut-meats, pour into buttered pans, let stand overnight, cut in squares and roll in powdered sugar.

Cut with small round cutter, work fragments together and roll out again. The cream may be delicately colored with a drop or two of vegetable coloring.

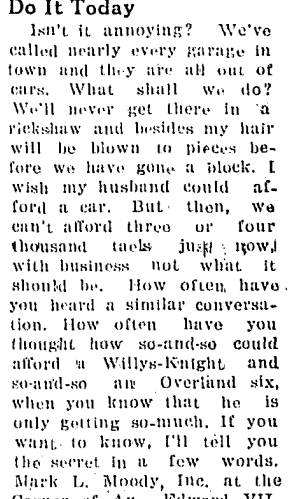

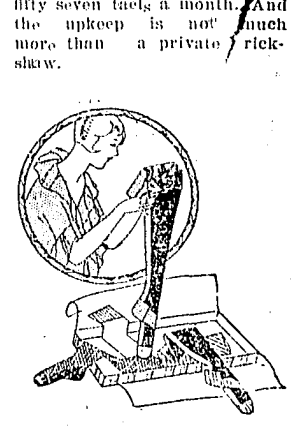
**Rich Cocoa Sauce**  
 1½ cups boiling water  
 ½ cup sugar  
 3 tablespoons cocoa  
 ½ teaspoon salt  
 1½ tablespoons flour or cornstarch  
 ½ teaspoon vanilla extract  
 1 teaspoon butter  
 Mix together cocoa, sugar, cornstarch or flour and salt. Pour boiling water over these, stirring constantly. Return all to saucepan with butter and cook three minutes. Add flavoring, after sauce has cooled slightly.

**Cottage Puffs**  
 1/2 cup butter or vegetable fat  
 ½ cup sugar 1 egg ½ cup milk 1½ cups flour 1½ tea. spoons baking powder 1-3 teaspoon salt 1 teaspoon vanilla extract  
 Cream butter, add sugar, flavoring and eggs, lightly beaten. Sift and add flour, baking powder and salt and beat all thoroughly. Bake in well-oiled individual pans in moderate oven—about twenty minutes. Serve with rich hot sauce.
