Referring to the reporting instructions under the subject of "Calendar of Events" calling for an annual report on the subject of exhibitions, fairs, expositions and international conferences, I may report that there are none scheduled to my knowledge which take on international character or are sufficiently significant internationally to warrant mention in this connection. The Minister of Industry has announced that he is interested in developing an exposition for domestic handicraft arts, but details in connection therewith have not yet been made public.
