Subject: Educational Films for South China Exhibition.

This will acknowledge your letter of January 18, 1932, in which you asked us for a list of recommendations of reliable American film buyers who would be willing to negotiate with your Harbin contact and have him arrange shipping to the United States.

In the absence of Mr. Arnold, who is en route to Manchuria, your letter of January 16, 1932, regarding educational films, has been referred to the writer for attention.

I send you, herewith, a list of the industrial films which we have in Shanghai. If Mr. L. K. Chu will indicate which ones he believes would be of interest in his work we can doubtless arrange to have them despatched to him by post if he is willing to stand the postal fees. This has been done for other Y.M.C.A. organizations in China.

As for highway films, I have several reels on Low Cost Surface Roads produced by the Highway Education Board, into which we have had Chinese titles put. These I should be glad to send to you on loan for Maynard's trip to Hainan Island. There is the possibility that Trade Commissioner Howard will be going south within the next two weeks, and if so I shall send the films with him. If not, I shall try to find some other responsible person in whose care I can entrust them.

I should say that practically all of the films we have available are the standard size film. Mr. Arnold has some 16 mm films which he uses almost constantly and is usually reluctant to loan out. But I shall discuss this matter with him upon his return.
