Sir:—

I am instructed by my Directors o draw your attention to the fact hat considerable interference, accompanied with threats of the worst lescription, is being, made with the Company's Chinese employees who, realising the necessity of the maintenance of the water supply to the Settlement and outlying districts, lave remained at work during the present crisis.

Unless this interference ceases, he Company cannot ask its employees to continue working and, needess to say, without sufficient labour t will be impossible to continue the supply of water.

I have to point out also that, in addition to the Company's employees being threatened, our deliveries of coal and other essentials are being interfered with by agitators and a cessation of these commodities will have the same effect as a shortage of labour.

Will you, therefore, be good enough to publish this letter in ord er that our consumers may realise that any cessation of supply wil not be the fault of the Company but of agitators and others who have no regard for the interests of their fellow-citizens.
