"Hankow, August 21 .-- Onlum is now openly sold in the streets of Hänkow as well as in all parts of the province under military protection. It is a common sight to see lumps of ordin and small tins of prepared opium displayed in the windows and on the shelves of shops, while onlym dens are found throughout the city. Many unium shops have notices posted mitside their shop such as:--"Cood Only For Sale," "Want- tary offcer of the lowest rank, Onlum Dust." etc. Many times the opium shops even boil their opium in the street in front of their house.
