OUR CONSTITUTIONAL FAMILY

With deepest sorrow we announce the death from heart failure on Nov. 16 at Manila of Most Wor. Bro. Samuel R. Hawthorne, our immediate Past Grand Master, who had since 1932 visited the three older China Lodges seven or eight times. Our sincere sympathy and condolences to the Grand Lodge which has thus suffered the loss in the prime of his career of its most active Mason of recent years.

The D.D.G.M. takes this means of sending warmest fraternal greetings to all brethren of the Philippine Jurisdiction in China, and particularly to those of Amity Lodge No. 108, wishing each and every one a gladsome merry Christmas and a brighter, happier and more prosperous New Year, and at the same time, craving for them a deeper personal appreciation of the beauties of the Craft by way of elevating them to a deeper sense of the international brotherhood which binds us into one sacred band or society of friends.

The D.D.G.M., having prepared and printed for general distribution among Masons of this our Masonic District a folder containing 44 Administrative Instructions for Lodge Secretaries and Officers, urges all brethren, especially those to be elected in all five Lodges this month, to make careful study of those instructions and faithfully carry them out in the performance of their duties.

Wor. Bro. A. J. Brace, P.M. of our Szechuen Lodge No. 112, was conferred an honorary doctorate by the University of British Columbia last June. To add to his joy, a new grandson was born to him in Chengtu, the happy parents being Bro. and Mrs. Carmon S. Brace of the same Lodge.

Bro. Chik-Ho Lam of Pearl River Lodge No. 109 passed thru Shanghai en route to Kuling on Nov. 30 where his family had preceded him a few weeks ago.

Bro. David C. Graham, acting secretary of Szechwan Lodge, spent a week in Shanghai, and lectured at the Royal Asiatic Society on "The Customs, Art and Religion of the Chuan Miao" whom he has studied for the last 15 years. He held a long conference with the D.D.G.M., before going on to Nanking and Tsinan on Nov. 6.

Bro. Joe Shoong of San Francisco, one of the few Chinese Masons in California, visited Shanghai for some weeks in November and attended Amity Lodge on Nov. 30.

Amity brethren interested in Scottish Rite degrees may ask any of the 30 odd members of the Red Lodges among us who will be glad to propose them for admission. In this connection, it may be stated that during the last three years of "Confusion in the Temple", to wit: the suspension of fraternal relations between the Grand Lodges of England, Scotland, Ireland and Massachusetts on the one hand and our own Grand Lodge on the other, the Scottish Rite, as such, has stood by us, and the Sovereign Grand Commander, Illustrious Brother Cowles, has written in our behalf. This salutary attitude has, among other considerations, brought a new sense of the fitness of things Masonic to the Constitutions differing with us regards Masonic expansion in China. We trust that true harmony will in the very near future be restored to the Orient, and for it, we feel a peculiar pleasure in endorsing the Scottish Rite, among whose ranks we find so many of our brethren both of Amity and of other Lodges in this District. Wor. Bro. J. M. Henry of Pearl River Lodge and our own Bro. H. T. Chang are taking the red degrees this autumn.

The brethren of West Lake Lodge No. 113 expect to hold their installation ceremony on Saturday, the 19th of December. As the Right Worshipful D.D.G.M. has been invited to instal the Master-elect and invest the new officers, he will be glad to have as many brethren of this District accompany him as can conveniently make it possible to do so.

Consider the wealth of our luxurious flowers at all seasons and their numerous lovely colors which never clash but always blend and harmonize! Our Fraternity, too, can prosper by the variegated talents of its many gifted members, inspite of the fact that each brother is endowed with an individual temperament. It is necessary, however, for all temperaments to work together in peace and brotherly love that genuine harmony may result.

Brotherhood, charity, truth and all the cardinal virtues taught in the several degrees often seem trite and empty, but once brethren seek actually to practice them in and out of the Lodge, they spring to life with remarkable force, for is it not eternally true, that as you give of yourself, in that measure will you receive?

**PROVISIONAL RULES GOVERNING
USE OF AMITY MASONIC LIBRARY:
ADOPTED FEBRUARY 9, 1937.**

Books may be borrowed for a period not exceeding one month from date of issue. No more than two books may be taken out by one member at one time.

An "Issuing Slip" will be provided for each borrowing, to be properly filled in, signed and handed over to the Librarian or the Lodge Clerk. Each book will be marked on the slip pasted on back inside cover with a stamp giving the date of issue and return.

All Issuing Slips will be consecutively numbered and duly registered.

An up-to-date list of Library books is kept in the Library for Members' reference.

A Special "Delay Charge" will be imposed at the rate of Five Dollar Cents (\$0.05) per day for each day's delay over one month, and will be devoted to the Charity Fund.

Books damaged or lost must be paid for in full in addition to the "Delay Charge."

Brethren who, living outport, desire to borrow books from the Library, are required to refund postage for mailing, and on returning, books must be sent by registered mail in order to avoid loss.
