






Flat Head Round Head Fillister Head

EDITOR'S PREFACE

Seeing that correct and detailed information about the Chinese Students in the different schools, colleges and universities in the United States will facilitate better understanding and communication among themselves, and will enable leaders of affairs, both here and in China, to locate the students who are best trained for service in different important undertakings that will be promoted from time to time, the Chinese Students' Alliance in the United States of America has undertaken the publication of the "Who's Who of the Chinese Students in America."

This publication is modeled after the well-known annual "Who's Who in America." It aims to present a biographical sketch of the Chinese students in this country—their nativity, age, education (general as well as specific) and their professional or technical experience. It is the first attempt of the Chinese Students' Alliance at anything so comprehensive, and is to take the place of the "Chinese Students' Directory," which gives but little information about the students and has been found very unsatisfactory in comparison with what this new publication aims to be.

The material from which this work has been compiled is taken from questionnaires filled out by our fellow-students in the different universities and colleges, through the co-operation of the officers of the local Chinese Students' Clubs. Most of the material is new, but some of it is taken from questionnaires filled out during the preceding administration of the Alliance, under the direction of the ex-secretary, Mr. C. C. Lin, now chairman of the Eastern Section of the Alliance. It is to be regretted that some of the material is not strictly up to date, but it was found impractical to collect it all anew without unduly postponing the date of publication. The editor can only hope that he will have the forgiveness of his fellow-students and others for the book's imperfections.

The editor has endeavored to make the information herein published as complete and accurate, and as useful as possible. But much of the information, including many home addresses, came written in Chinese, which has been found difficult to translate so as to be understood by other people. Some of this information has had to be omitted entirely.

A work of this character, in the hands of an editor without previous experience of this kind, cannot be free from errors and inconsistencies. Those who will kindly call attention to such defects will greatly help to make the next issue more satisfactory.

The editor is indebted to Mr. C. C. Lin, ex-secretary of the Alliance, for the preliminary work he did in the preparation of the questionnaires and in the collection of much of the data in this book; to the chairmen and also to the secretaries of the local clubs, through whose co-operation and assistance the questionnaires were properly filled out and promptly forwarded. And particularly hearty gratitude and deep appreciation must be expressed to K. S. Hor, C. H. Chao, M. C. Shen and S. T. Chen, associates of the editor, who have faithfully co-operated in many ways and have helped to read and correct the proof sheets.

Finally, due acknowledgement must be given to those advertisers who have recognized in this work a medium for reaching the Chinese student body in this country, thus establishing important connections for themselves while enabling us to reduce the cost to the Alliance of publishing the book.

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CONSTITUTION OF THE CHINESE STUDENTS' ALLIANCE IN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

Note—This Constitution was revised May 20, 1920, by the Constitutional Amendment Committee, consisting of M. J. Bau (chairman), F. C. Lin, and Albert Ding; and ex-officio members M. H. Chou, president of the Alliance, and C. P. Chow, S. K. Wei and S.M.Chang, sectional chairmen. It was approved by the General Council and ratified by the members at Sectional Conferences, and is effective on and after September 6, 1920.

Article I—Name and Definition.

Section 1. The name of this organization shall be "The Chinese Students' Alliance in the United States of America".

Section 2. By "Chinese Students" are meant persons who are Chinese by birth, descent, naturalization or marriage, according to the nationality of China, and who are students enrolled in universities, colleges, academies, high schools and other educational institutions of secondary rank, or who are engaged in practical training. By "the United States of America" is meant the continental territory of the States, excluding Alaska.

Article II—Objects

Section 3. The objects of the Alliance shall be:

- (a) To labor for the general welfare of China, both at home and abroad, and
- (b) To promote the common interests of the Chinese students in the United States of America.

Article III—Division into Sections.

Section 4. In order to satisfy more adequately local conditions and needs, the Alliance shall be divided into sections—the Eastern Section, the Mid-Western Section and the Western Section.

Section 5. These sections shall have the power and duty:

- (a) To elect sectional officers;
- (b) To elect active members;
- (c) To hold annual conferences; and
- (d) To make laws governing their individual activities and interests not conflicting with the constitution and by-laws of the Alliance.

Section 6. This constitution shall be supreme throughout the Alliance, anything in the constitution of the sections to the contrary notwithstanding. And the power to act in all matters affecting the welfare of the whole Chinese student body in the United States of America shall reside in the Alliance and not in the sections.

Article IV—Membership

Section 7. The Alliance shall have five kinds of membership, namely, active, associate, honorary, alumnus, and life.

Section 8. (a) Any Chinese student in the United States of America, who possesses a sound mind and a good character, may be elected to active membership by the proper sectional authorities.

Only those members who have been duly elected to active membership and who have paid their annual dues shall be active members and only such members shall have the right to vote and be eligible for alliance or sectional offices.

(b) Any person, except a Chinese student in the United States, who manifests any interest in the alliance and who possesses a sound mind and a good character, may be elected to associate membership by the General Council. Applications for associate membership shall be sent to the Alliance Secretary.

(c) Any person who has rendered distinguished service to China or to the Alliance, and whom the Alliance wishes to honor, may be elected to honorary membership by the General Council.

(d) Any member upon departure from the United States of America becomes an alumnus member. He shall have the same rights and duties of the active members except the right to vote and to hold office.

(e) Any member may become a life member upon the payment of a life fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00), or the equivalent in the foreign currency.

Section 9. The transfer of active members from one section to another shall not affect their status in the Alliance.

Section 10. Resignation from active membership shall be sent to the proper sectional authorities; from honorary and associate membership to the Alliance Secretary. No resignation from active and associate membership may be accepted as such, unless the member resigning has fully discharged his obligations to the Alliance.

Section 11. Any member who violates the constitution of the Alliance or any of its sections or who commits an act of misconduct, after due investigation and conviction by the respective authority who has charge of resignation of members, shall be deprived of his membership.

Article V—Officers.

Section 12. The Alliance shall have a General Council composed of the Councilmen elected by the several sections, with the following as ex-officio members: the executive officers of the Alliance, the Chairmen of the sections, the Chief Editors and Managers of the Chinese Students' Monthly and the Chinese Students' Quarterly, and the Chairmen of all the local clubs of the Chinese Students' Alliance. For at least 15 active members a section shall delegate one Councilman, and for every additional 30 above the first 15 another. Any vacancy in the General Council caused by absence, resignation, and any other disability, shall be filled by the proper sectional authorities.

Section 13. The General Council shall have the power:

(a) To initiate constitutional amendments and by-laws;
(b) To interpret the constitution;
(c) To make all necessary and proper laws to carry out the objects of the Alliance;

(d) To elect honorary and associate members;
(e) To raise revenues;
(f)—To vote appropriations from the reserve fund; and
(g) To impeach the Alliance officers for the neglect of duties and the violation of the constitution and other laws.

Section 14. For revenue and appropriation measures and the election of honorary members, a two-thirds majority vote shall be required. For the impeachment of the Alliance officers, a three-fourths vote shall be required. For all other measures, a simple majority shall suffice.

Section 15. In the event of urgent needs or ultimate deficits the General Council shall levy pro rata assessments on and to be paid by the members of the Alliance.

Section 16. The Alliance shall have an Executive Council composed of President, a Vice President, a Secretary, a Treasurer and Chairmen of the Sections. If possible they shall meet at least once a year. The President shall call the meeting and determine the time and place of the conference.

The Editor-in-chief and the Manager-in-chief of the Chinese Students' Monthly and the Chinese Students' Quarterly may attend the meeting of the Executive Council when their interests are involved.

The Executive Council shall pass the budget and determine the general policies of the Alliance.

Any vacancy in the Executive office of the Alliance shall be filled by the Executive Council with the approval of the General Council.

Section 17. The President and other officers of the Alliance shall be nominated and elected by the outgoing General Council. The election of the new President and other officers shall be published in the June issue of the Chinese Students' Monthly. And the new officers shall assume office on July 1st.

Section 18. The election procedure shall be as follows: The President shall appoint an Election Committee consisting of members chosen outside of the General Council. The said Committee shall send to all the Councilmen the names and addresses of all Councilmen, regular and ex-officio, and also the names and addresses of all the sectional officers, with the nomination ballots. Each Councilman shall nominate four names for the candidacy of the four offices—one for each. After the first ballot has been returned the Committee shall count the ballots and regard all who have been nominated by two or more Councilmen as candidates. Upon the acceptance of the Candidates, the Committee shall send out the second ballot to all the Councilmen. And upon the return of the second ballot the Committee shall declare any candidate receiving the majority vote for any office as elected and shall send out the two names for any office receiving the highest number of votes, in case no candidate receives the requisite majority vote. And upon the return of this third ballot the Committee shall declare the one receiving the majority vote as elected.

Section 19. The President shall enforce this constitution and all laws made thereunder. He shall also represent the Alliance and direct the affairs thereof.

He shall have the power to call meetings and appoint committees. With the advice and consent of the General Council, he shall have the power to take all other measures that may be necessary and proper to carry out the objects of the Alliance.

The President shall make annual report of the year's work to the several sectional conferences.

Section 20. The Vice President shall assume and discharge all the duties and powers of the President in event of the latter's absence, resignation or any other disability. He shall also conduct the impeachment proceedings of the President, but the said President shall not be removed or disposed except upon conviction by the General Council.

Section 21. The Secretary shall conduct the correspondence of the Alliance and report the same to the President. He shall notify all candidates of their election to honorary and associate membership. He shall keep copies of all communications. He shall keep a record of the Alliance for the year during which he is in office. He shall also cause to be published and distributed among all the members, before the first of December of each year, a handbook of the Alliance, containing the Constitution, By-laws, Who's Who, and other valuable information.

Section 22. The Treasurer shall collect, receive and have custody of all the dues, fees, and contributions belonging to the Alliance, and pay all bills within the estimates of the annual budget; when any bill goes outside its proper estimate, it shall be passed by the General Council before payment may be made. He shall submit, at the end of his term of office, to the Auditing Committee of two or more, a full account of his official transactions.

Section 23. The term of office of both the General and the Executive Council shall be one year.

Section 24. The officers of the Alliance, in times of special need, shall have power to appoint assistants whose work and whose name shall be included in the final reports.

Article VI—Finance.

Section 25. All the members of the Alliance, except the honorary members, shall pay an annual membership of \$3.00, \$.50 to go to the sections and \$2.50 to the Alliance, which payment shall include the privileges of the Alliance publications.

The sectional treasurer shall, under the direction of the Alliance treasurer and in co-operation with the treasurers of the local clubs, collect the membership fees, and shall remit due quota to the Alliance treasury.

The sections shall be responsible for the payment of the subscriptions of the publications which their members may take, and this responsibility lies no matter whether the members pay or not.

The publications shall receive appropriations from the Alliance equivalent to the subscriptions of the members who take the publications. The managers shall make quarterly reports to the President and the Treasurer of the Alliance, and in case of emergency, they shall report to the authorities in question. The Alliance, however, shall be responsible for the profits as well as the losses of the publications.

Article VII—Publications.

Section 26. The Alliance shall publish annually an 8-issue monthly in English, known as the Chinese Students' Monthly, and a quarterly, in Chinese, known as the Chinese Students' Quarterly.

Section 27. The Monthly shall be published by a Board of Editors under the direction of an Editor-in-chief; its business shall be conducted by a board of Managers directed by a Chief Manager.

Section 28. The Editor-in-chief and the Manager-in-chief shall be nominated and elected by the respective existing boards in April. The retiring chiefs shall conduct the election and after confirmation shall cause the names of their successors to be published in the June issue of the Monthly.

Section 29. To encourage service and efficiency, a number of the associate editors and managers shall be selected by the process of competition. The said competition shall be open to all the Chinese students who are members of the Alliance. The merit for choice shall be determined by the service rendered to the Monthly. The detailed regulations of the competition shall be made by the Editor-in-chief and the Manager-in-chief, respectively, subject, however, to the repeal of the General Council.

The associate editors and managers who win their positions through competition shall have the privilege to serve on the existing board and also on the incoming board, of the ensuing year. They shall also be eligible for the position of the Editor-in-chief and the Manager-in-chief. Their appointment, however, shall be confirmed by the General Council.

Section 30. The number of the associate editors shall be equal to the number of the Councilmen in the General Council, and shall be distributed among the several sections in the same manner as the Councilmen shall be distributed. Any positions on the Board of Editors, not filled by the successful competitors, shall be filled by the popular election at the annual conferences of the sections, each section to fill the vacancies unoccupied by the successful competitors of the section.

Section 31. The Editor-in-chief and the Manager-in-chief shall have the power to appoint department editors and managers. They may also request the retired Editor-in-chief and Manager-in-chief to serve as advisors.

Section 32. The Chief Manager shall make quarterly report of the financial conditions of the Monthly to the President, and in case of exigencies he shall report to the President without delay. Otherwise the Alliance will not be responsible for the deficits.

Section 33. The term of both the editorial and managerial board shall be one year; the successful competitors shall, however, be privileged to serve on the existing board under which the competition was held and also in the incoming board of the ensuing year.

Section 34. The organization and work of the editorial and managerial boards of the Chinese Students' Quarterly shall be governed by the same principles as those of the Monthly boards.

Section 35. The policies of all Alliance publications shall be subject to the control and revision of the General Council.

Article VIII—Amendment.

Section 36. Any amendment to this constitution when initiated by the General Council and approved by two-thirds of all the sections but one at their next succeeding annual conferences or in absence of such conferences by the Board of Representatives of the Section, shall become valid and binding as if a part thereof.

CONSTITUTION OF THE EASTERN SECTION OF THE CHINESE STUDENTS' ALLIANCE IN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

Note: Please note that the Amendments of the Alliance Constitution have made some of the articles in the Sectional Constitutions inoperative.

Article I. Name and Definition.

Section 1. The name of this organization shall be "The Eastern Section of the Chinese Students' Alliance in the United States of America".

Sec. 2. By "Eastern" is meant the stretch of territory covered by the states of Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Connecticut, New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, West Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Florida and the District of Columbia.

Article II. Objects.

Sec. 3. The objects of the Section shall be:

- (a) To subserve the objects of the Alliance; and
- (b) To promote the interests of the Section.

Article III. The Board of Executives

Sec. 4. The Section shall have a Board of Executives composed of a Chairman, a Vice-Chairman, a Chinese Secretary, an English Secretary and a Treasurer, who shall be nominated and elected at its annual conference. The term of the Board shall be one year, from the end of one conference to the end of another. Any vacancy, caused by absence, resignation or any other disability, shall be filled by the Board of Representatives in accordance with this Constitution.

Sec. 5. The Chairman shall enforce this Constitution and all laws thereunder made and generally direct the affairs of the Section. With the advice and consent of the Board of Representatives he shall have the power to call meetings, appoint committees, and take all other measures that may be necessary and proper to carry out the objects of the Section. At the end of his term of office he shall submit a full report of the work and progress of the Section.

Sec. 6. The Vice-Chairman shall assume and discharge all the powers and duties of the Chairman in the event of the latter's absence, resignation or any other disability.

Sec. 7. The Chinese Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the Section that is in Chinese.

Sec. 8. The English Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the Section that is in English, take minutes of all meetings, and notify all candidates of their election by the Section to active membership in the Alliance.

Sec. 9. **CONSTITUTION OF THE WESTERN SECTION OF
THE CHINESE STUDENTS' ALLIANCE IN
THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.**

Article I. Name and Definition.

Section 1. The name of this organization shall be "The Western Section of the Chinese Students' Alliance in the United States of America."

Sec. 2. By "Western Section" is meant the stretch of territory covered by the states of Montana, Utah, Wyoming, Colorado, New Mexico, Idaho, Arizona, Washington, Oregon, Nevada and California.

Article II. Objects.

Sec. 3. The objects of the Section shall be:

- (a) To subserve the objects of the Alliance; and
- (b) To promote the interests of the Section.

Article III. The Board of Executives.

Sec. 4. The Section shall have a Board of Executives composed of a Chairman, a Vice-Chairman, a Chinese Secretary, an English Secretary and a Treasurer, who shall be nominated and elected at its annual conference. The term of the Board shall be one year, from the end of one conference to the end of another. No person may be eligible for the same office for three consecutive terms. Any vacancy caused by absence, resignation or by any other disability, shall be filled by the Board of Representatives in accordance with this constitution.

Sec. 5. The Chairman shall enforce this Constitution and all the laws thereunder made and generally direct the affairs of the Section. With the advice of the Board of Representatives, he shall have the power to call meetings, appoint committees, and take all other measures that may be necessary and proper to carry out the objects of the Section. At the end of his term of office he shall submit a full report of the work and progress of the Section.

Sec. 6. The Vice-Chairman shall assume and discharge all the powers and duties of the Chairman in the event of the latter's absence, resignation or any other disability.

Sec. 7. The Chinese Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the Section that is in Chinese.

Sec. 8. The English Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the Section that is in English, take minutes of all meetings and notify all candidates of their election by the Section to active membership in the Alliance.

Sec. 9. The Treasurer shall collect, receive, have custody of all dues, fees, contributions, Reserve Fund, and property belonging to the Section, except the Oration Fund. He shall pay all bills not exceeding twenty-five dollars each in value and others when vised by the Auditor of the Board of Representatives. At the end of his term of office he shall submit a full report of his official transactions.

Sec. 10. The Oration Fund shall be under the charge of a Committee of three to be elected during the Annual Conference; one of whom shall be the Treasurer of the Section and two as trustees from the Chinese merchants in San Francisco.

Article IV. The Board of Representatives.

Sec. 11. The Section shall have a Board of Representatives from all qualified groups of active members in the Section. For at least five active members a group shall be qualified to delegate one representative; and for every additional ten above the first five, another; but no group, however large, may have more than five Representatives. The term of the Board shall be one year, from one conference to another. No member of the Board of Executives may be eligible for office on this Board. Any vacancy, caused by absence, resignation or any other disability, shall be filled by the respective group of Alliance members.

Sec. 12. (a) The Board shall have the power to raise revenues, vote appropriations, elect active members, accept their resignations or deprive them of their membership, and enact all necessary and proper laws to carry out the objects of the Section.

(b) Any Representative may initiate a proposal for consideration by the Board. For revenue and appropriation measures, a two-thirds majority vote of the Board shall be required; for all other measures, a simple majority shall suffice.

(c) In the event of urgent needs or ultimate deficits, the Board shall levy pro rata assessments on, and to be paid by, the Active members in the Section.

Sec. 13. The Board shall have a Chairman, a Secretary, and an Auditor who shall be elected from and by the Representative under the charge of the sectional English Secretary.

Sec. 14. The Chairman shall generally direct the affairs of the Board.

Sec. 15. The Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the Board.

Sec. 16. The Auditor shall vise all bills exceeding twenty-five dollars each in value before payment by the Section Treasurer.

Article V. Delegates to the Alliance.

Sec. 17. The Section shall nominate and elect at its annual conference a number of delegates to the Alliance, as required by Sections 7, 20 and 27 of the Alliance Constitution. Any vacancy, caused by absence, resignation or any other disability, shall be filled by the Section Chairman with the advice and consent of the Board of Representatives.

Article VI. Membership.

Sec. 18. The Section shall elect only candidates who reside in its territory to active membership in the Alliance. All applications or resignations shall be sent to the Section Secretary.

Sec. 19. Every active member in the Section shall pay annually to the Section Treasurer three dollars (\$3.00).

Article VII. Conferences and Meetings.

Sec. 20. The Section shall hold one annual conference, the time and place of which shall be determined by the Section Chairman with the advice and consent of the Board of Representatives. An extra charge of fifty cents (\$.50) gold, shall be levied on every non-member in attendance at the annual conference.

Sec. 21. Active members in the Section may meet as often as necessary for transacting any business of the Section.

Article VIII. Amendment.

Sec. 22. Any amendment to this Constitution, when initiated by the Board of Representatives and approved by the next succeeding annual conference, shall become valid and binding as if a part thereof.

THE EVOLUTION OF THE CHINESE STUDENTS' ALLIANCE IN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

1. 1902—Formation of the Chinese Students' Alliance of America (later the Pacific Coast Chinese Students' Alliance) by twenty-three Chinese students from Berkeley, Oakland and San Francisco in San Francisco Congregational Church.
2. 1903—Formation of the Chinese Students' Summer Alliance of the Mid-West by the Chinese students in Chicago.
3. 1904—Formation of the Ithaca Chinese Summer Students' Alliance by the Chinese students of Cornell and vicinity.
4. 1905—Organization of the Pacific Coast Chinese Students' Association Aug. 13 (later the Berkeley Chinese Students' club).
Aug. 28-30—Organization of the Chinese Students' Alliance of the Eastern States.
5. 1906—Amalgamation of the Ithaca Chinese Students' Alliance with the Chinese Students' Alliance of the Eastern States.
6. 1907—Constitution of the Eastern Alliance revised.
7. 1908—Creation of a Joint Council to consider the amalgamation of all the Chinese students' organizations in America.
8. 1909—Combination of the Chinese Students' Alliance of the Mid-West with Feb. the Chinese Students' Alliance of the Eastern States.
Oct. Combination of the Chinese Students' Alliance of America with the Pacific Coast Chinese Students' Association into the Chinese Students' Alliance of the Western States.
9. 1910—First Joint Council elected.
Aug. Adoption of "the principle of having one Alliance of Chinese students in North America" in the first Mid-West Conference at Evanston, Illinois.
Oct. Recommendation of "a National Alliance with sectional managements under Central Government Board."
10. 1911—Adoption of Alliance constitution by three sections at their respective conferences.
First National Executive Committee elected.
11. 1912-21—Rapid growth of the organization and wide expansion of the scope of its activities.

This short historical account unmistakably points to the wonderful development of the Alliance and the great organizing genius of its founders. Through the untiring efforts of our eminent predecessors, Dr. C. C. Wang, Dr. Wellington V. K. Koo, Dr. C. T. Wang, Mr. David Yui, and others, the organization has become a most powerful and useful one among the Chinese Students in the United States at present. Their worthy example in the past should give inspiration to the present officers and members to carry on the work which they have nobly started.

With several hundred copies at the beginning, now its edition has been swelled to several thousands circulated throughout the world and patronized by the thinking Chinese and Americans. The same thing holds true with the "Quarterly." "Who's Who" is entirely a novel feature this year and will prove a very valuable reference book for both the members and the people at home.

WHAT THE CHINESE STUDENTS' ALLIANCE HAS DONE IN THE PAST

1. The Alliance has published the "Chinese Students' Monthly" for the last fourteen years.
2. The Alliance has issued the "Chinese Students' Quarterly" for the last seven years.
3. The Alliance has published six issues of the "Chinese Students' Directory."
4. The Alliance has held annual conferences under the auspices of its sections for the last ten years.
5. The Alliance has done everything within its ability for the welfare of the Chinese students in this country.
6. The Alliance has received and entertained the new students from China most cordially in San Francisco and Chicago.
7. The Alliance has done some social welfare work among the Chinese business men. It has always aimed to promote the cordial relationship between the students and their compatriots.
8. The Alliance has honored many distinguished Chinese and Americans by electing them to honorary membership who have rendered great service to the Alliance and to China.
9. The Alliance has represented and interpreted China in a true light to the American public through its official organ, the "Chinese Students' Monthly".
10. The Alliance has always stood by the will of the Chinese people and voiced their sentiment.
11. The Alliance has fought most strenuously against the unjust decision on the Shantung question by sending its delegation to interview the senators of the United States. Many local clubs such as New York, Oberlin, Michigan, Illinois, etc., have issued special pamphlets on Shantung questions.

4. The Alliance is publishing "A Special Handbook for the Use of Officers."
5. The Alliance is maintaining a Bureau of Research to investigate the educational, social and industrial conditions in the United States for the use of our people.
6. The Alliance is cultivating cordial relationships with other Chinese students' organizations.
7. The Alliance is maintaining a Bureau of Information to combat the malicious Japanese propaganda which has misrepresented our nation and our people.
8. The Alliance is considering the creation of a home chapter in China.
9. The Alliance is maintaining a Bureau of Employment to help students to secure work during the Summer months.
10. The Alliance is preparing for a National Convention to be held in Northwestern University, Evanston, Illinois.

5. To identify themselves with the Alliance's ideals of unselfish service and self-sacrificing service, which are the corner-stone virtues of New and Great China.

Duties of Members

The duties of the members of the Alliance are:

1. To obey the constitution and by-laws of the Alliance and all other measures passed by the Council of the Alliance from time to time.

2. To pay their yearly dues of \$3.00, and other special assessments levied by the Alliance.
3. To be willing to make sacrifices for the good of the organization, if necessary.
4. To be willing to entertain warm fraternal feelings toward other members of the Alliance.
5. To strive to live up to the ideals of the Alliance—**unselfish service and self-sacrificing leadership**.
6. To consider themselves part of the Membership Committee, to arouse interest among those who have not yet joined the Alliance, with the ultimate purpose of making a Greater Chinese Students' Alliance.

To Non-Members

1. The Chinese Students' Alliance will welcome **you** to membership because we believe that you are a person of sound moral character and a potential leader in the future of our common country.
2. We will welcome **you**, because you have an irresistible desire to serve you fellow countrymen here and those at home.
3. We will welcome **you**, because you have many common national problems to solve as we have and you want to discuss them with us in our annual conferences.
4. We will welcome **you**, because you want to use our official organs to interpret China to the Americans.
5. We will welcome **you**, because you will bring us new spirit and ideals to the organization.

The Chinese Students' Alliance is the largest and most powerful organization among the Chinese students in the United States of America. It is non-partisan and non-sectarian in nature. It is an organization of the Chinese students, by the Chinese students and for the Chinese students. It is the organization which you can not afford to be remain without.

If you weigh the Three Dollars annual membership fee on the one hand and all the material and spiritual advantages of membership on the other, you will conclude at once that you should join the Alliance immediately.
