PREFACE

This Handbook has been published with a threefold purpose in view. The first purpose is to give information concerning Chinese student activities with their names, addresses and courses of study. Besides serving our fellow students, such information will be useful to our own country men, American friends, research workers, historical records, vocational recommendations, and references. The second purpose of the Handbook is to aid communication. For the new student in this country who is anxious to know where his old friends live, or for the old residential student who would like to know the new comer, such a guide will be very helpful. For the student who would like to know his Alumni friends, for the one who would like to know his "comrades," or for the one who would like to know those studying in the same line as he, the Handbook will be found to be a companion of great help. Again, those studying certain problems, or desiring facts, opinions and information; need only look into the Handbook in order to communicate with the qualified person or interested friend. The last purpose of the Handbook is that of unification. There are 1,327 fellow-students distributed among eighty-one institutions. Although we do have a few alumni, social, religious, and professional organizations, yet we need a unified organization of the whole. The Students' Alliance is one, the Handbook is another. The Handbook contains a record of over a thousand of our Chinese friends. It follows you any time and anywhere. It shortens the distance, and makes for spiritual unification among thousands of students.

The Handbook has been composed from six sources: (1) Individual correspondence, (2) Office of the Registrars of the various institutions, (3) Local student's clubs, (4) Catalogues from institutes, (5) Personal interviews, and (6) Chinese Educational Mission, Washington, D. C. Due to the fact that addresses are always changing, that some institutes and clubs would not respond to the questionnaire, the Handbook does not pretend to claim perfection or completion. If, however, your name or that of your friend does not appear in this Handbook, notify the Editor at once, and such information will be asserted or corrected in the next issue.

The Handbook is free to every Chinese student. It is mailed to **The Chinese Students Clubs, c/o The Office of the Registrar** of one's institution. In case there is no local club, please inquire at your Registrar.

We wish to express our warm thanks to the Officers of the local clubs, the Registrars of each institution, and the Chinese Educational Mission. We are also greatly indebted to the advertisers who have given us financial support. To all our fellow students we want to extend our best wishes for your academic success and experiential progress.

A HISTORICAL SKETCH of the ALLIANCE

- 1902—Formation of the Pacific Coast Chinese Students' Alliance by twenty-three Chinese students from Berkeley, Oakland and San Francisco in San Francisco Congregational Church.
- 1903—Formation of the Chinese Students Summer Alliance of the Mid-West by the Chinese students in Chicago.
- 1904—Formation of the Ithaca Chinese Students' Alliance by the Chinese students of Cornell and vicinity.
"The Dragon Student"—the first annual (in Chinese) published by the Ithaca Chinese Students' Alliance.
- 1905—Organization of the Chinese Students' Alliance of the Eastern States.
"The Dragon Student"—the second annual, in both Chinese and English, published by the Chinese Students' Alliance of the Eastern States.
First Conference of the Chinese Students' Alliance of the Eastern States at Amherst, Mass.
- 1906—Amalgamation of the Ithaca Chinese Students' Alliance with the Chinese Students' Alliance of the Eastern States.
- 1907—Constitution of the Eastern Alliance revised.
The first "Chinese Students' Monthly," published under the editorship of Dr. V. K. Wellington Koo.
- 1908—Creation of a Joint Council to consider the amalgamation of all the Chinese students' organizations in America.
- 1909—Combination of the Chinese Students' Alliance of the Mid-West with the Chinese Students' Alliance of the Eastern States.
- 1910—First Mid-Western Conference at Evanston, Ill.
Adoption of "the principle of having one Alliance of Chinese students in North America" in the first Mid-West Conference at Evanston, Ill.
Recommendation by the Joint Council of "A National Alliance with sectional managements under Central Government Board."
- 1911—Adoption of Alliance Constitution by three sections at their respective conferences.
First National Executive Committee elected.
Tenth Conference of the Western Section at San Francisco, Cal.
- 1912—First "Chinese Students' Directory" of the whole Alliance published in the "Monthly."
- 1914—"The Chinese Students' Annual" changed to "The Chinese Students' Quarterly."
- 1921—New publications added: "Who's Who of the Chinese Students in America," "The Alliance Pamphlet," and "Special Handbook for the Use of Officers."
Creation of six committees, namely, Chinese Publicity, English Publicity, Finance, Friendly Relations, Newspapers, and Speakers, to fight against the unjust decision on the Shantung question during the Washington Conference.
- 1925—Constitution of the Alliance revised, the sections abolished, etc.

1927—Constitution revised. Five standing committees provided: National Affairs Committee, Publication Committee, Committee on Legal Defense, Election Committee and Committee to receive suggestions for Constitutional Amendments.

Publication of the 'New China Weekly, (in English).

Finances systematized. Five different funds set up: National Affairs Fund, and emergency Fund.

1928—Special pamphlets on China issued. Coast-to-coast tour to consolidate Alliance organization to have a united front against Japanese imperialism realized.

New local clubs incorporated.

Permanent secretary with a permanent office recommended.

1929—"A night in Peking" was held on November 26 at the International House, New York, N. Y.

1930-31—Due to political opinion divergence, the Alliance was paralyzed.

Activities of the Alliance.

1. It publishes the "Chinese Students' Monthly" in English) and the "Chinese Students' Quarterly" (in Chinese), which are devoted to the discussion of national and international questions and to the encouragement of creative scholarship, among the Chinese students.

2. It issues an annual Handbook containing valuable information, interesting records, and a complete directory of Chinese students in this country.

3. It issues pamphlets and circulars occasionally which are of special interest to the Chinese students.

4. It calls annual sectional conferences to discuss China's national problems and to promote the social, athletic and intellectual activities of the Chinese students.

5. It endeavors to help promote the welfare of the Chinese students in this country.

6. It stands by the will of the Chinese people and voices their sentiment.

7. It co-operates with other organizations in this and other countries for the promotion of international understanding and good will.

8. It especially endeavors to help interpret China to America, combat malicious propaganda against her in this country, and better the understanding between the two sister Republics.

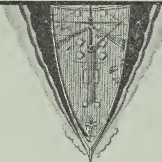
