

Women Returned Students on Lecture Campaign

On Saturday last Miss Grace Yang, secretary of the Women Returned Students' Club gave a lecture on "The Strength of China" at the Wu Tseng Girls' School, and today Miss Eling Tong spoke on "Patriotism" at the Chinese Girls School.

Both young ladies are active in the Returned Students' Club which has started its program of lecturing to the older school girls and the women of the various churches on current topics relating to China's modern problems.

In this they are following their own program of disseminating useful information as well as cooperating with Popular Educational Movement, and have thus far met with very favorable receptions, since they are among the few returned students who have taken up the serious question of combatting the general ignorance among women as to vital present-day affairs of their land.

Next Tuesday at 61 Range Road, the Returned Students will have their monthly meeting when modern Chinese poems will be read by Mrs. Mei, 'president of the Club' and also some English translations of the most popular of Chinese songs. This will be a combination business and literary meeting, when a series of topics will be announced for the members to write papers on various subjects of contemporary feminine interest.

The work of different members of the Club in Shanghai has attracted much attention, letters of commendation having been received from as far North as Harbin and as far South as Canton, while comment upon the remarkably favorable showing as compared with the Men Returned Students' Union which in numbers far excel the women but hardly their enthusiasm and energy.
